

Mammoth Lakes Library E-Resources - Ana Danielson

The Mono County Library website, www.monocolibraries.org, offers a number of electronic Library resources. You don't need to leave the house to check out a book or magazine, you can access electronic books and magainzes through our website. For e-books try **OverDrive or Enki**, for a wide-selection of magazines, both current and past issues, try **Zinio**. All of these applications are available under the E-Library tab on the Library's website. Need an audiobook, OverDrive has them also. You may renew or place holds on library books through our website, you will just need your library card number and password. For more information on how to use our website to access electronic resources or your library account ask a staff member.



Mammoth Lakes Library Activities - Ana Danielson

In June the Library Authority Board voted in favor of moving the MakerSpace to the current young adult non-fiction room, this will provide more space for Makers and equipment which quickly outgrew the current space and have overflowed into the seating area outside the MakerSpace. The MakersSpace attracts participants of all ages and has anywhere from 8 to 28 Makers at a time working on a variety of projects, including sewing, 3D prints, jewelry making, unlimited creations with popsicle sticks and other objects, Snap Circuit projects and much, much, more. In May, MLFOL held their "You Are Fabulous!" fundraiser (see May/Spring issue of MLFOL newsletter at the library's website) which raised over \$12,000. The MLFOL Board of Directors voted to use \$10,000 of this to support the MakerSpace.

Cindy Sprague, the Summer Reading Program Coordinator, has been busy offering fun reading activities to students in K through 10th grade. This year's theme is "Read for the Win" and, for the second year in a row, we are collaborating with Mammoth Unified School District to offer students to take AR tests, a program used by the schools which allows students to track their reading levels, comprehension and set goals for improvement.

JULY 4TH CHILDREN'S BOOK GIVE-AWAY by Lou Stewart

Under a colorful parachute, surrounded by American Flags, nearly 1,000 gently used children's books found new homes with kids of all ages at the July 4th Book Chalet event. The deck adjacent to the store was bustling with kids, parents, and even grandparents between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. that day and the enthusiasm for reading was high. We were fortunate to have a great selection of books in excellent condition that appealed to a range of ages, from toddlers to teens. We even had a "Read Along With Me" display table of books and included parents in the "one free book per person" give-away criteria (as long as they promised to read it to their child)!



Thanks to the high energy and winning smiles of our volunteers for the day, the final count from the donation jar set a new record for July 4th at the Book Chalet: \$326.00. Between the deck and the store, the Book Chalet results totaled almost \$500 and an immeasurable number of happy young

State Librarian's Mono County Visit

On July 21st, California state librarian, Greg Lucas, toured the libraries of Mono County with the able assistance of Mono County Library Director Ana Danielson. He allowed extra time at the Mammoth Lakes branch to attend a reception and listen to community members' concerns, suggestions and compliments. Annual Federal funding for California libraries has been used to start our local branch's MakerSpace as well as the Intercambio program, which is an adult program that facilitates Spanish-English language exchange.

Mr. Lucas indicates that he has found libraries to be community gathering centers as he travels around our state. Certainly that is the case here with the Ellie Randol Reading Room which also houses The Gallery Wall. He has found that libraries are a trusted, safe resource for all people. And, he wants more of California's innovation and creativity to focus on our public libraries.
