When: Thursday, Aug 30 - Saturday, Sep 1



Time: 10:00 am to 3:00 pm each day

Recently I had the opportunity to talk with Ana, she said, "I am ready for a change after 17 years in Mammoth Lakes. My experiences here have been wonderful. I have had a lot of opportunities to grow, but I really miss teaching."

When I asked her about accomplishments in her position as Mono County Library Director, she indicated that she worked with Mono County Office of Education in various programs and projects to help the library system to be a financially sound County institution.

In terms of her future, Ana plans to teach Spanish early literacy, and adult literature in Spanish in Mexico. She possibly will teach classes to tourists and some ESL.

In closing, she said, "I have loved every minute living here, the mountains are beautiful. I hope to resurrect The Intensive Spanish Summer Institute and visit all my friends."

We will miss Ana's smile, warm friendship, willingness to listen, and ability to help solve challenges.

Now on to the new faces:

Beatriz Veja is a new Library Assistant. She has lived in Mammoth Lakes for 14 years. Her mother moved the family here, so

they could grow up in the mountains. When I asked what she enjoyed doing when she was not at the library, she said, "I enjoy spending time with my one year old son, Norberto, taking classes toward an Associate Degree in Childhood Development, and spending time with my family," she added, "I do not have a lot of free time."

I did ask her what her favorite category of books was, she replied romance.

Because I have a family member whose given name is Beatrice, I asked Beatriz what she preferred to be called, she smiled and said Bea.

If you are in the library, please stop and introduce yourself. Bea is very knowledgeable about the library and also speaks Spanish.

Ana Cerut is also a new Library Assistant. When asked how long she had been in Mammoth Lakes, she said off and on for the last six years. She said rock climbing and the mountains are what originally brought her to our area.

When not working in the library, she likes to bike, swim, and run. Her hobbies include photography and hanging out with her dog, Perrita. She added that he is a rescue dog she found on a trail in southern Spain.

Her favorite all time book she recalled reading when 10 years old, is "Watership Down", she added that, "it really got me into reading." "Master and Margareta" by Bulgakv is also a favorite book "because of its humor and fantasy. It is grounded in real surroundings and dreamy."

Lori Michelon is a Library Assistant at both Mammoth Lakes Library and Crowley Lake Library. She is also a Special Projects person for MCOE.

I spoke with Lori when she was in the Maker Space area of the library. There were five elementary school age girls who were actively engaged with diverse creative projects while we talked occasionally and, when asked, she assisted one of the girls. She has an excellent rapport with children. She has been

moving back and forth to this area in the area since 1974. Her parents were leaving Southern California, so her brother moved to Mammoth, then she decided to move here also.

When she is not working at one of the libraries, Lori said, "I teach at Cerro Coso. My classes include Studio Art and Art History." In the Fall, she will teach at the Bishop College campus. She smiled when I asked about her favorite book, she replied, "Winnie the Pooh." She added that she read it to her daughter when she was a little girl. Her daughter is now grown and a college graduate.


Red Wagon discounted books are on display in the hallway under the store's display window. \$2 hardbacks and \$1 paperbacks while supplies last, so stock up now!



Job Description / Essential Elements:

Definition:

Operates the Mono County Library System.

Supervision Exercised and Received:

Under direction of the Executive Officer of the Mono County Library Authority Board, performs professional library duties in the Mono County Library System; assists school and branch library personnel in the selection and utilization of library materials and equipment; evaluates library services and personnel; develops and implements appropriate public information programs promoting and encouraging the use of public library facilities; creates and implements special programs for the library system; does related work as required.

Examples of Duties and Responsibilities:

Duties and responsibilities may include but are not limited to the following:

- Plans, directs, and supervises library programs for the Mono County Library System
- Interviews and selects personnel
- Recommends appropriate policies, rules, and regulations and implements those adopted
- Evaluates, selects, and recommends purchase of furniture, materials, and equipment to meet system, personnel, and patron needs
- Plans, assigns, supervises and participates in circulation, cataloging and reference work
- Interprets system programs to personnel and the public
- Prepares the annual budget, annual reports, and special statistical reports
- Plans and supervises instruction in library skills
- Attends professional conferences and workshops
- Supervises federally funded and special projects related to the library system
- Meets with the public to promote the use of the library and to discuss needs and problems
- Interacts with local agencies and organizations to coordinate and promote library activities
- Creates public relations releases and advertisements
- Serves as an advisor to the Mono County Friends of the Library and its chapters

Knowledge of:

- Library organization, administration, trends, services, materials and equipment
- On-line databases, management and circulation systems, word processing and spread-sheet programs
- Public relations principles and practices
- Accounting procedures, programs, and equipment; principles and techniques of supervision

Ability to:

- Install and use on-line systems, library management systems, and related programs and equipment
- Implement access and training programs for Internet
- Participate in Mountain Valley Library System network planning development; cooperate with library patrons and staff members
- Install and customize computer programs and equipment
- Perform accounting procedures for budgetary control
- Coordinate work and needs of staff members and branches
- Research in-depth reference questions on the Internet .

Experience and education:

- MLIS degree from a graduate library school program accredited by the American Library Association
- Bachelors degree required
- Demonstrated knowledge of principles and practices of public administration and of the laws applicable to library service in this state.
- Three years of professional public library experience required, five years, and general Administrative duties preferred.

Physical Requirements:

Meet the physical requirements necessary to safely and effectively perform assigned duties, including lifting twenty-five (25) pounds frequently and fifty-five (55) pounds on an occasional basis and in excess of fifty-five (55) pounds with assistance. Ability to work at a desk; ability to stand for extended periods of time; ability to see for purposes of reading rules and policies and other printed matter; ability to hear and understand speech at normal levels; ability to communicate so others will be able to clearly understand; ability to operate office equipment; ability to bend and twist; ability to reach in all directions.

- TB testing
- Fingerprint background check
- Compliance with the MCOE dress code and other policies.


- Bachelors' degree required, Masters' degree in Library Science from an accredited college or
